



Kenwood Yulupa Brut Sparkling

Kenwood Yulupa Cuvée Brut is a medium-dry sparkling wine made in the traditional méthode champenoise style. This sparkling wine is a blend of classic grape varieties from select vineyards taking advantage of fruit sourced from the diverse microclimates of California.



COVEY RUN DRY RIESLING

Covey Run's Dry Riesling contains just enough residual sweetness to round off the racy acidity and citrus peel flavors of the grape. Swirl a glass and smell the complex peach, melon and honeysuckle aromas. In the mouth, exploding honey, nectarine and peach flavors lead to a long, full finish.



Monkey Bay Sauvignon Blanc

A vibrant bouquet of citrus and tropical fruits, layered with subtle cut grass aromas. Monkey Bay Sauvignon Blanc is a charming, elegant wine, displaying intense varietal character. Ripe, zesty flavours of grapefruit, kiwi and pineapple are overlaid with fresh cut grass. Finishing crisp and refreshing, the palate balances intense fruit qualities with fresh acidity, fullness and length.



Benziger Chardonnay

A minimum of six months' aging on the lees follows. Fifty to 75% of the wine undergoes spontaneous malolactic fermentation to lend it a buttery richness and then spends eight months on the lees in barrel for roundness and texture. The style is full throttle fruit, highlighted by ripe citrus and tropical notes, supported by good acids and a rich, silky mouthfeel. Tropical fruit, browned butter and nutmeg aromas marry with flavors of pineapple, sweet red apple, coconut and hazelnut. The finish is well integrated with good fruit intensity.



Louis Jadot Beaujolais Villages

Intensely fragrant and crisp, Beaujolais-Villages Jadot is a vivacious, succulent wine of exceptional charm full of bright, floral fruit flavors underscored by youthful, peppery notes and plump tannins. Delicious slightly chilled, its lively freshness is best appreciated when young.

Ravenswood Icon

Most enophiles would agree that Ravenswood's rich, spicy style recalls the Rhone wines of southeastern France. So it's no surprise that, for some time, Joel Peterson has been working with Syrah, the great grape of that region. Finding the pure California version of the varietal a tad heavy, Joel has added Grenache, Mourvedre and even Viognier to create a fascinating, mouth-watering melange. The result — Icon, made exclusively from Sonoma County fruit — occupies a delicious position between the deep, structured elegance of Cornas and the sumptuous complexity of Chateauneuf-du-Pape. (Funny, that still sounds a lot like Ravenswood.)
